

## Current project status

By mid may 2018, all individual indicators for successful vocational training for refugees had been developed. All project partners worked equally on the results and through the ongoing exchange between the partners, the indicators could all be worked out and described. The consecutive close exchange between the partners was of immense relevance in this respect.

By editing and optimising each indicator by each partner country, it has been ensured that the indicators can now reflect the best possible EU-wide status.

## Second transnational project meeting

After six months of identifying and developing indicators, the second transnational project meeting was scheduled for the end of June. The entire project team met in Roskilde in Denmark and worked very intensively together. Initially, the individual indicators were discussed and these were further supplemented and optimized together, and in a further step the final indicators were presented in a structured manner. Further important milestones for the project were successfully worked out through extremely fruitful discussions. The second transnational project meeting focused on the application of the identified indicators.



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In the end, each partner was able to drive home with clear structures, agreements and jointly considered deadlines in order to start the implementation exactly in their home institution. Immediately after the meeting, the central points of the meeting were summarized so that each of the project partners could be on the same level.



In the coming months the work can thus be continued continuously and the quality indicators can be applied. Close cooperation between the project partners remains indispensable, as the third and last transnational project meeting will take place in Cologne in February 2019.

## Prospect

All project partners which are involved will carry out initial research into potential practical measures. This research serves as a first overview to develop a pool of measures (in total 120), which is then used to select five best practice examples. The identified and developed indicators are applied to all measures in order to finally identify the best practice examples. Five best practice examples per partner country are to be identified. A regular exchange between all project partners should continue.
