Current project status

Since the second transnational project meeting in Roskilde in June this year, the goals set have been achieved so far. The work was thus continued and the quality indicators are currently being applied.

The research on practical measures for integration through vocational refugee training has already been completed and 30 measures per partner country (120 in total) have already been developed from this pool. The previously identified and elaborated quality indicators are currently being applied to most of these measures, or have already been applied. Trends can already be identified at this stage as to which of the measures could ultimately be identified as best practice. A final result to identify the five best practice examples per partner country is expected by the end of October.

It was of immense importance for the quality of these interim results that a regular exchange between the partners was guaranteed; because only because of this the uniformity of the project could have been demonstrate. All project partners worked equally on the results and through the continuous exchange between the partners the indicators could be applied to the identified measures accordingly.

Perspective

A next important and interesting milestone will be the identification of the five best practice examples and the exchange with those responsible for these projects. With this milestone, the development of the first draft of the supranational handbook can be continued.
